What is the Heartland Collegiate?

The Heartland Collegiate - provided through Campus EIPS - provides career-focused education programs designed to provide students with real-world skills and post-secondary opportunities while still in high school. Through hands-on learning, industry partnerships, and dual-credit options, students gain valuable experience, certifications, and a competitive edge for their future careers.



Who Can Enrol?

The Heartland Collegiate programs are open to students entering Grade 11 or 12 or those choosing to return for a fourth year.

It is <u>recommended</u> that students have successfully completed or be co-enrolled in:

- English Language Arts 20-1 or 20-2
- Math 10C
- Science 10
- Five credits in a related 20-level Career and Technology Studies (CTS) course or equivalent work experience.

Where Are Programs Held?

Heartland Collegiate - through Campus EIPS - is not a single brick-and-mortar school but a network of specialized learning locations - both in-person and online.

Integrated Schedules: Dual-credit opportunities integrate with a student's regular high school program to potentially earn post-secondary credits concurrently. These courses can occur;

- In-person
- Online
- Hybrid


Heartland Skills Center - Opening 2026-27
